Summary

Roberto Pedersini is Full Professor of economic sociology and Head of the Department of Social and Political Sciences at the Università degli Studi di Milano, Italy.

Roberto Pedersini has a long and extensive experience in the field of employment and industrial relations. His main current research interests concern labour market regulation and policies and industrial and employment relations. He has both participated and coordinated several research projects in these fields since the early 1990s at both national and international level.

He has collaborated with the International Labour Office, the European Commission and the European Foundation for the Improvement of Living and Working Conditions in several occasions. He was the Chief Editor of the 2014 edition of the biennial European Commission's "Industrial Relations in Europe" report and, in 2012, he contributed to the 2012 edition of the same report.

-Since October 2020, he is Head of the Department of Social and Political Sciences of the Università degli Studi di Milano.

-Since 2011, he is member of the Committee of the Ph.D. programme in Labour Studies of the Università degli Studi di Milano. Between May 2019 and September 2020, he was deputy coordinator of the Ph.D. programme.

-Between January 2009 and March 2015, he was the Director of the Interdepartmental University Research Centre "wTw - Work, Training and Welfare" of the Università degli Studi di Milano.
